CENSUS 2021

Your help is needed with the census which gathers vital information to help plan services such as transport, education and healthcare. For the first time the Census is 'digital first' which means that the questionnaire is online and paper questionnaires are only available to those who specifically request them.

You must complete the census by law

Look out for your invitation pack in the post. It will show you how to complete your census. Your answers will be protected by law and will be kept confidential.

If you need help completing the census, from now until 4th May, **Citizens Advice in North & West Kent** is the designated Census Support Centre for Gravesham Borough. To speak to a **Census Support Adviser**, **please call 0330 053 7333**.

The adviser can support local residents over the telephone in a number of ways:

- Answering specific questions people might have about the Census process or specific questions within the Census.
- Creating a new Census access code for someone who has lost

- their ONS letter (these should be being received by every household in the coming days).
- Talking people through step-bystep completing the Census themselves online.
- Completing the Census on someone's behalf, by asking them the questions over the telephone and entering their answers into the online questionnaire. This process is completed live and no answers are recorded outside of the official ONS system.

HOW TO BOOK A SYMPTOM FREE COVID TEST



Everyone without symptoms should get tested every 2 weeks, especially if they are leaving the house for a necessary reason, such as going to work or shopping for essentials. Around 1 in 3 people with COVID-19 have no symptoms, so get tested regularly to make sure you are not unknowingly spreading the virus.

You can book an appointment at any of the 22 sites across Kent.

These sites are in addition to the regional and local testing sites for people who have symptoms. Symptom-free testing sites are being set up using funding from central government to support local councils and help reduce rates of COVID-19.



NEW NOTICEBOARDS IN THE PARISH

We have purchased a new 3 bay noticeboard for Judson's Pavilion. We are currently awaiting delivery of this, which is due at the end of March. We are now looking into a new noticeboard for Camer Parade and are currently looking at designs.

JUDSON'S RECREATION GROUND

Councillors approved funding and a contractor to replace the wetpour safety surfacing at the fenced-in playground area. The climbing net on the climbing frame is also to be replaced along with a new flat swing. Work is due to commence in April.

We are also currently looking at designs for replacement trim trail equipment which had to be removed due to the equipment reaching the end of its life span. We are limited by the space available for this but once we have researched further into designs, we will consult Meopham residents on this. FLY-TIPPING

We have received an update from Gravesham Borough Council on a flytipping offence which occurred in Camer Park Road on the 17th February. During the day a tipper deposited a large amount of UPVC door and window frames in a farmer's field to the west of Camer Park Road. Fortunately, this incident was witnessed and a vehicle registration

obtained. GBC are currently in the process of an investigation into this offence and have identified the company the vehicle belonged to. It transpires that the offender for the fly-tip was a former employee who has since been sacked. They were shocked by the incident and have since attended the location and removed all the waste. GBC will be prosecuting the offender.

BUDGET INFORMATION

The Parish Council agreed to set the parish precept at £119,067.00 for 2021-22. This will cost local tax payers £34.94 per year for the average band D property which is an increase of £3.98 per year compared with 2020-21. Meopham is still considerably below the national band D average for parish councils, which in 2020-21 was £69.89 per annum.



As always, the Parish Council is mindful

of the financial resources required for its community facilities such as the Judson's recreation ground, play area and car park, Judson's Pavilion, its village green open spaces, the public toilets, allotment grounds, trees plus various pieces of street furniture around the parish. With grant funding increasingly difficult to acquire in the current climate, the parish council is having to budget carefully and use some of its reserves for repair work. For example, this year we are using part of the play area 'sinking fund' for the replacement of the wetpour in the play area which has seriously deteriorated.

The Parish Council is also having to look at taking back ownership of the streetlights in the parish from Gravesham Borough Council after enjoying a maintenance agreement with them since 1980 as GBC have now given notice to terminate all such agreements. It is hoped that once brought up to an adoptable standard, KCC will take on the maintenance and adoption of certain streetlights in the parish. Others will have to be maintained by the Parish Council in the future if they are to remain. With this in mind the Parish Council has had to increase the precept to fund the future maintenance costs involved here to start building up its resources in preparation for the handover of certain streetlights.
